

7:07PM: Under the deck light, this is a fat little guy. It's a maximum of 2" long. After this image, the last I looked it had hopped off the siding. What remains is a 5-6" long wet spot on the deck. I hope it found a safe home. This is the closest I have seen to an albino anything. I can find no frog or toad that is like it.



8:37PM: I take recycling to the curb and find this big fellow. Compare the size of the pin oak leaf to the size of this frog. I guess its body is 4-4.5" long. Right after this photo it hopped away!



Oct. 5, 2018, 84 DEGREES: Brian and I drive US-67 toward Alton, IL. Just before the beautiful bridge to Alton, we turn right toward the Audubon Center at Riverlands, pelicans rest on a tiny island. We are told we will see more birds if we come back in November. We are north of the confluence of the Mississippi and Missouri rivers.



Oct. 5, 2018: The Mississippi River is high as we ferry across from Brussels, Illinois, to St. Charles, Missouri.



OCT. 8 2018, MONDAY: I enjoy a field trip to Hermann, MO, with the Wildwood Garden Society. We tour the Living History Farm that is dedicated to preserving and presenting the unique agricultural, social, and economic history of the German immigrants who settled the lower Missouri River Valley in the mid-1800s.




Oct. 17, 2018, Wed., 6:38pm: WOW! A gorgeous sunset greets me after my weekly Pilates Reformer class.

OCT. 21, 2018, 5:50 AM, CDT: Off to Colorado...

<u>7:26AM</u>: Wispy tendrils of fog rise as we cross the Missouri River. Where was my camera? I love to see the sun side-lighting cattle that are grazing on grass.

7:57AM: A horizontal rainbow of lavender to blue to gray turns into a cloudless blue sky. The temperature along our drive has ranged from 28-33 this morning. Are those red bushes small sassafras trees?



IO:37AM, 55 DEGREES: A murmuration (of starlings?) enjoys the sunny, gorgeous Konza Prairie Nature Preserve to the north as we drive west on I-70 through the beautiful Flint Hills.

I2:05PM: We are halfway to Loveland!

3:49PM MDT, 80 DEGREES: In Limon, CO, Brian buys two Frostys at Wendy's. By the time we are halfway to Brush, CO on CO-71, the straw in my Frosty collapses. When Brian finishes his, I switch for his strong straw. My Frosty lasts 75 miles, from Limon all the way to 4:23pm in Brush, CO.

OCT. 22, 2018, MONDAY: Yes! Nancy, my incredible metal chaser, finished my four large pieces and fourteen 1:6 scale and they are now with Dale, my patina man.



Oct. 23, 2018: The view from our window at the LaQuinta. Good morning Longs Peak! We drive to Fort Collins to pick up *Cozy* waxes from Ben Cordsen, and then I work on my Alaska Journal. This afternoon, Brian gets the first oil change for my Tahoe.



OCT. 25: While Dale finishes my patinas, Brian, Beau and I take a break to go to Estes Park. Early in our drive on CO-34 we happen upon a big wiener! YUMMY reads the license plate on the Oscar Meyer WienerMobile!





Oct. 26, 2018, 7:31AM: Goodbye beautiful Long's Peak! I'm happy to see you from our room at the LaQuinta.

<u>9:45AM</u>: Sadly, I learn my long time photographer Mel Schockner has Parkinson's. He forgot our appointment and suggested I ask Jafe Parsons if he can shoot my two works, "Cozy" and "A Good Life" MW.

Luck is with me; Jafe picks me up from Mel's and takes me, and, my work to his studio. By 12:20PM he is finished shooting three views each of three pieces. His digital files will come via email.

Brian meets me at Jafe's and soon we are headed on peaceful back roads to Hayes, KS for the night. Headed to Arriba, CO, the roads turns into pavement with sand and no center stripe.

2:40PM: We come across a fork in the road. Brian checks for stop signs and takes the road that has none. We like adventures. We see windmills, so we must be close to civilization.

Speed limit is 55MPH on this two-lane dirt road! It is 67 degrees. At 2:52 the road is briefly paved and then turns to dirt once again. .



3:IIPM, MDT: We drive I-70 east from Arriba, CO, toward Hays, KS, where we will spend the night. Beau is in my lap. Grass eating cows are happy in Siebert, CO.



Oct. 27, 2018, 7:16AM CDT, 44 DEGREES: A gorgeous deep sunrise greets us as we head east from the pet friendly, budget friendly Baymont Inn. We have stayed in this comfortable little place since the 80s when it was first owned by Hampton Inn.

7:55AM: In Lincoln County, KS, Brian suggests I paint windmills. I hold that thought...



7:59AM: The sun rises outside of Ellsworth, KS. We are glad we made this trip at this time of the year. The

landscape is gorgeous!



IO:52AM: We are halfway home. Thank you, Brian, for driving. Facebook friend and collector Lisa Marie Peterson tagged me with a post of this very good picture of "Life's a Ball!" SS in the Art in the Avenues exhibit in Wenatchee, WA. Thank you, Lisa Marie, and, thank you, Cheryl Taylor, for posting your photo of my work!



12:39РМ, 68 DEGREES: It's an absolutely gorgeous day as I stroke Beau, my satin doll.

2:22PM: We are within a few minutes of home. It will be right at 500 miles and 6 hours 50 minutes from the Baymont Inn in Hays, KS. My 2018 Tahoe has traveled 5492 miles so far. It averaged 22.7 mpg. Life is Good.
