Nov. 25, 2022: Brian surprises me with his suggestion that we go for a ride. Where? To Alton, Illinois! Coltz is ready!










We take two ferries across the Missouri and the Illinois Rivers and also visit Elsah, Illinois, home of this peaceful old church.




A brisk north wind is blowing dry earth horizontally across the highway. Wind socks are horizontal! Good news: the sun is shining in this Dust Storm!




