

August 19, 2023: Around noon, I look out our glass storm door and see a mama turkey and two babies - not tiny, but young. They are walking on our path about 5 feet from our front door toward my pollinator friendly flower bed. When they get there, a Monarch butterfly flits out of the orange Butterfly Milkweed! I LOVE it!!!

August 31, 2023: The temperature today is so nice we have our windows open. Yay!


WOW! Washington University Physicians finally called regarding an appointment for the bone density test recommended by Dr. Bagegni. The earliest I can get in is early August 2024!

It is fun to drive Illinois 161 through the small towns on the way to Hoffman, where the population is now up to 500! It seems it was 250-300 when I was little. September 11, 2023

September 21, 2023: Today my wonderful Mercy occupational therapist states my right arm is less swollen than it was a week ago. Yay! She wants me to wear the arm compression sleeve for another two weeks to help prevent lymphedema. Yes ma'm!!!

My arrhythmia appointment is with Dr. Krainik's nurse practitioner was not as good. My heart is still in A-fib. She said Dr. Krainik suggests another cardioversion. No, thank you. I want to wait until after my October 13 mammogram to see if cancer is GONE. The good news is that the Eliquis rep visited the office today and gave her samples; I now have 2 weeks of free Eliquis worth around \$57 after insurance. Yay!

The AAA 110th Annual Exhibition online show extends through September 1, 2024. Enjoy!





Brian and our friend and eye doctor, Byron, on the right, leave for a


weeklong motorcycle trip to Texas. Another dear friend decided not to go because he and his girlfriend each got Covid.

I meet with my cancer surgeon Dr. Julie Margenthaler who tells me my mammograms are normal and showNO CANCER! I am to see her in a year. YAY!!!

Oct. 22, 2023, 6:20am, 46 degrees: We three, Brian, Coltz and I, are off to Loveland, Colorado for me to check metals prior to patina. A lone star shines brightly. Brian brings a good morning latte for him and a green tea latte for me.




Oct. 25, 2023: After completing necessary foundry, shipping, and wax chasing work, I have a free afternoon. I ask Jafe Parsons about photographing "Her Life's a Ball!" MW and he fits it in this afternoon. Thank you!!!

Oct. 26, 2023, 5:41am MST, We head toward home. It's been a grueling week of checking metals, taking them for patina, and then, for foam-in-place boxes. Between it all, we take several of my chased waxes to Ben in Ft. Collins for remolding. Then, there was wax chasing and my decision to try a new-to-me foundry for raw casting in hopes of having speedier completion this time.

I will meet with my atrial fibrillation doctor on Jan. 4, to schedule a installing a Pace maker..
